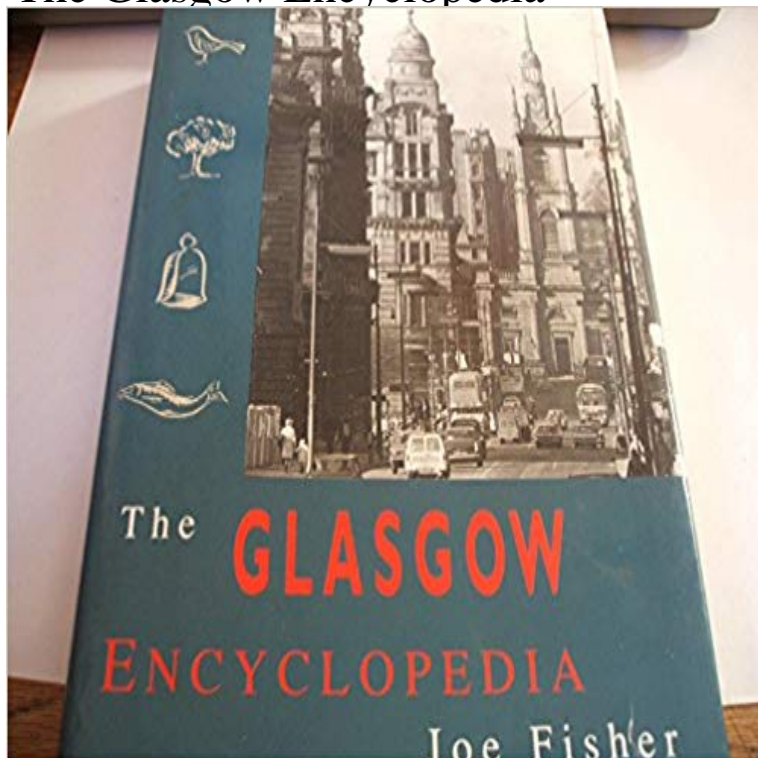


The Glasgow Encyclopedia
