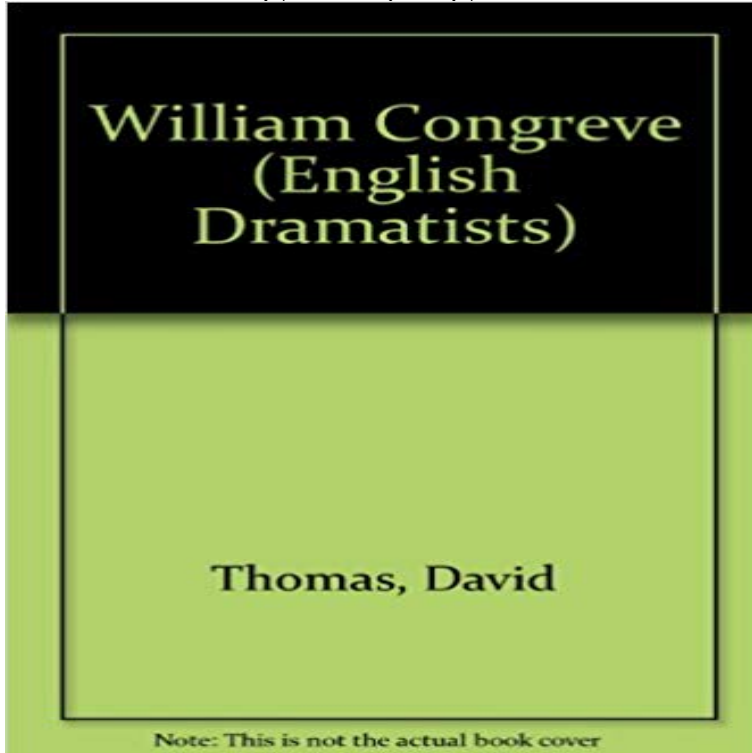


William Congreve (English Dramatists)
