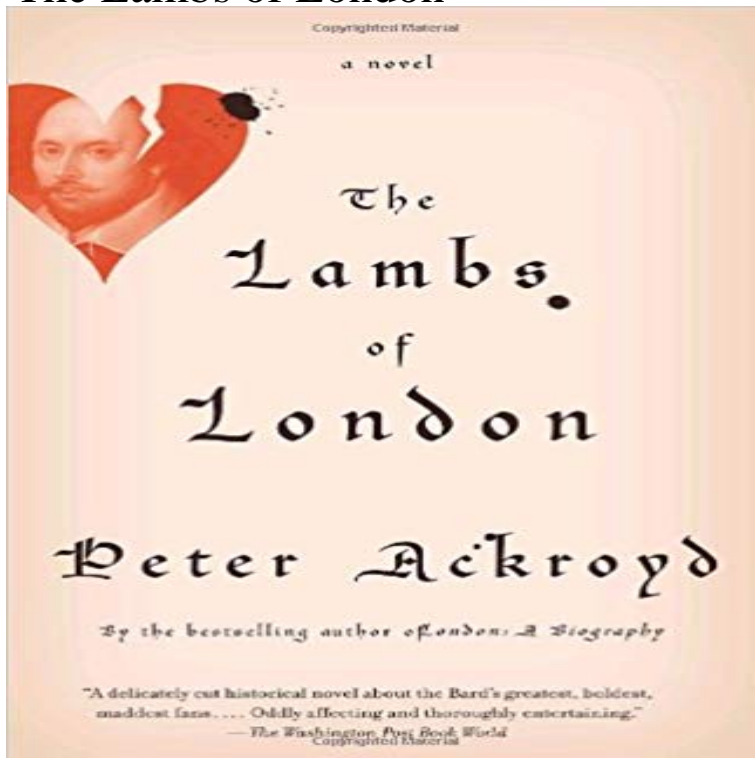


## The Lambs of London
