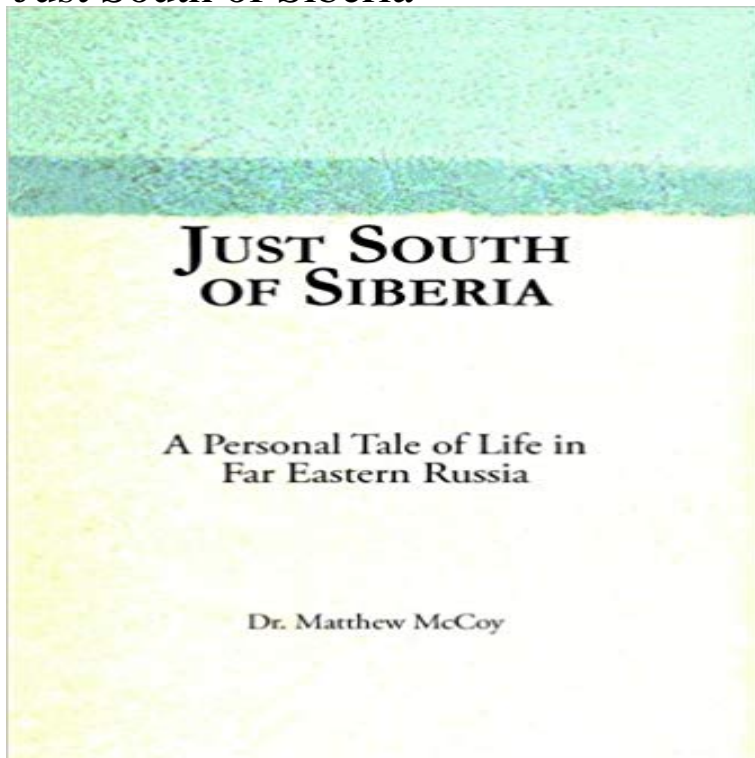


Just South of Siberia
