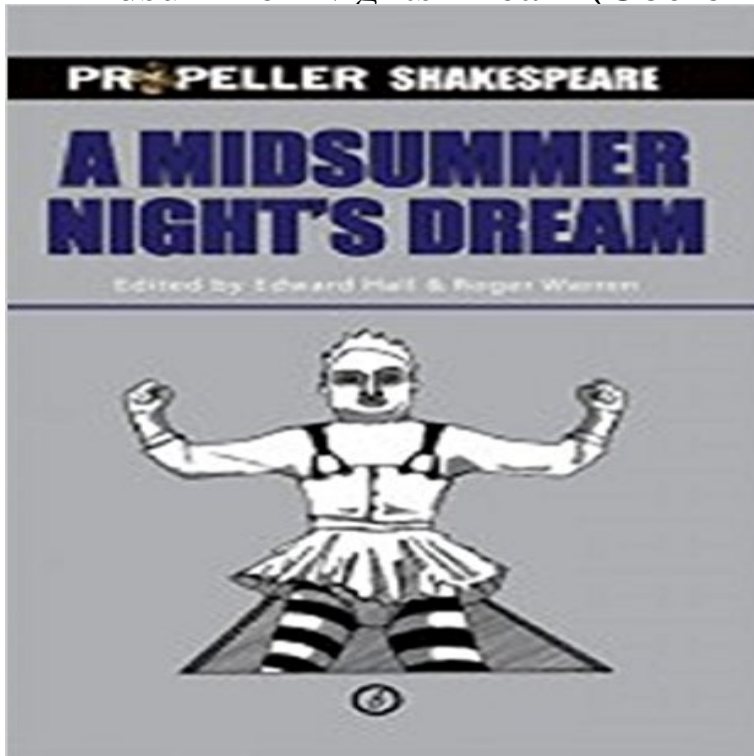


A Midsummer Nights Dream (Oberon Modern Plays)
