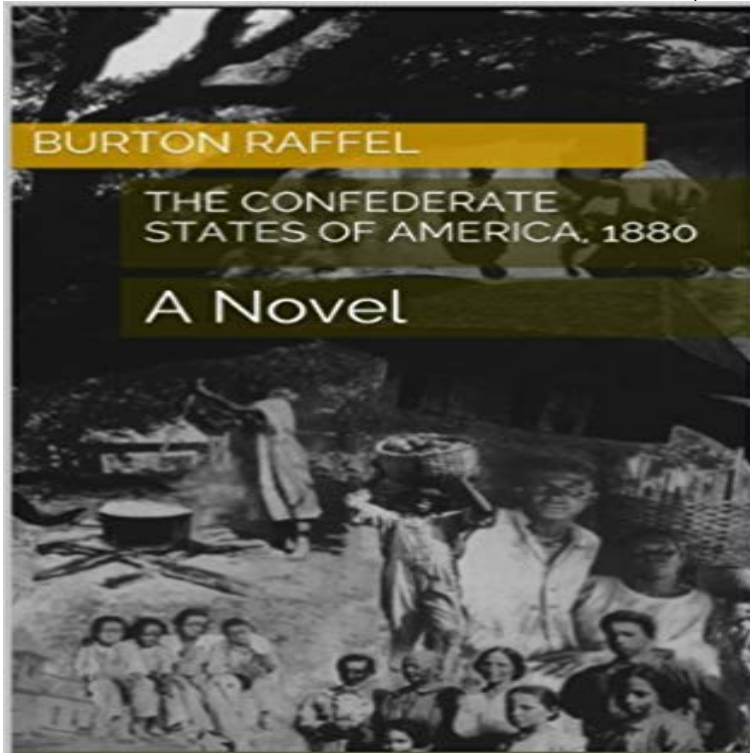


The Confederate States of America, 1880: A Novel
