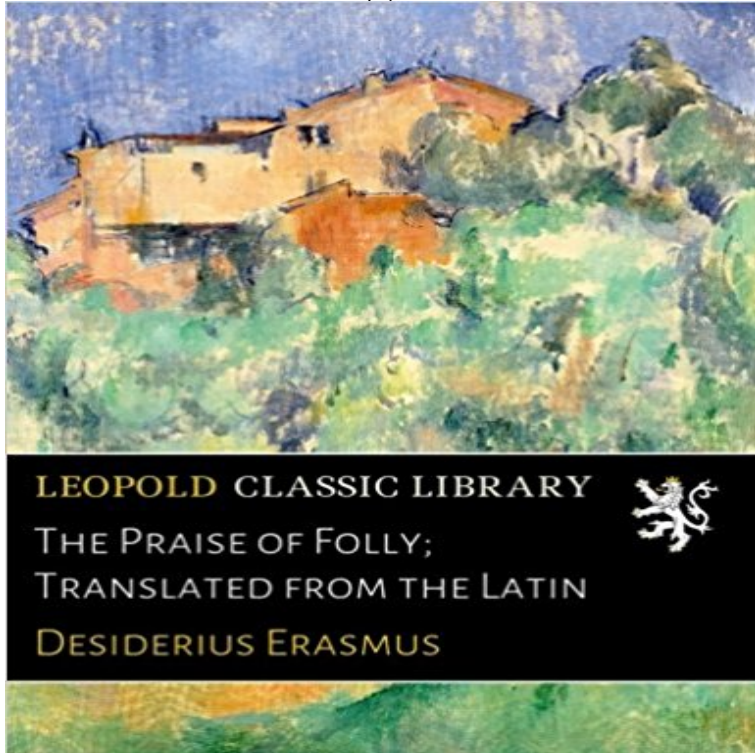


The Praise of Folly; Translated from the Latin
