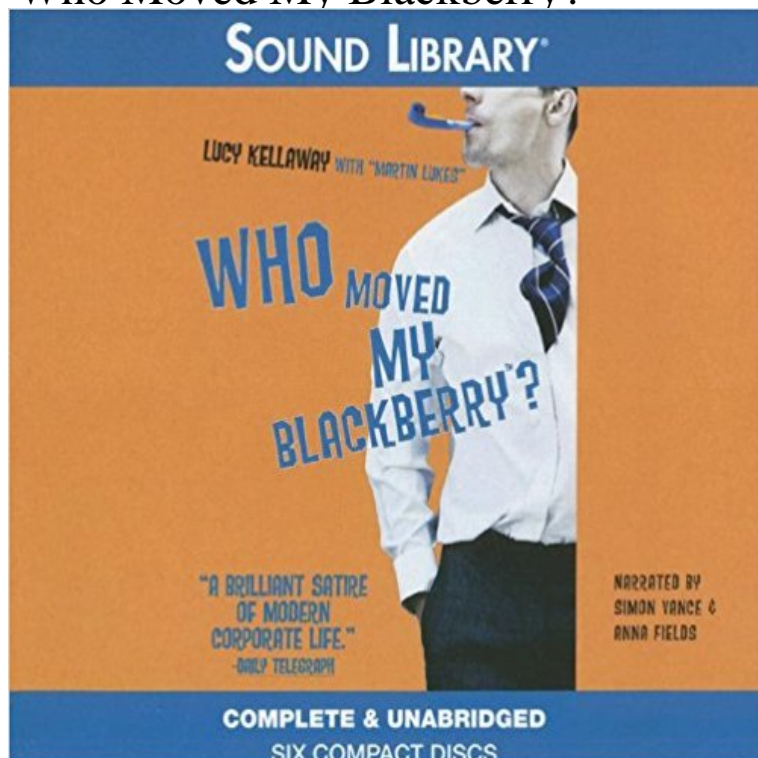


## Who Moved My Blackberry?
